Instruction for interviewer

Explain to the primary caregiver that the following questions are about the child's behaviors since last interview.

The primary caregiver needs to listen carefully and considers how frequently the following behaviors occur.

Show the cards about frequency, which are categorized into 4 scales as follows:

5 Mostly true

3 Sometimes

1 Not true

0 Not encounter

"Not encounter means that situation has never happened since last interview"

Mark the sign "X" on the number representing frequency of each ability in table 1.

Information for parents before asking questions:

The following questions are about behaviors that may happen in children.

Parents do not need to be worried if their children have some of the following behaviors.

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1) In the past 3 months, did the child have any of the following behavioral problems?
